[Twitter](#) is a great way to hear from and connect to others in your field with similar interests. It can give you direct access to teachers, schools, public figures, companies - anyone with a public Twitter account. Tweets are meant to be kept short and sweet (fewer than 140 characters). You can tweet multiple times a day to keep your followers informed because the twitter news feed is constantly refreshing with the latest tweets. TIP: Add imagery to your post for increased engagement!
